DATA SUMMARY

As of May 26, 2022: (using the last 14 days of full data and last 7 days of full data for positivity rate)

- **Incidence of New Cases:** 33 new cases over the last 14-day period **with no sustained increase over 5 consecutive days.**
- **Active Cases:** 26 cases **WITH NO sustained increase over 5 consecutive days** over a 14-day period
- **Positivity Rate:** 8.5% (last 7-days of full data). Testing below 30 tests per day indicates insufficient testing to adequately detect cases within the reservation. 1 of the 7 days were below 30 tested/day.
- **Health Care System Capacity:** Good, no strain related to COVID-19 and **0 hospitalizations**

BASED ON THE ABOVE DATA THE CURRENT INDICATED RISK LEVEL IS: LEVEL

Note: Although we meet the indicators to remain in the green level, we have a split in indicators. We will not go to the higher level as we did in the past due to the vaccination rate. We are at 51% vaccinated and that is helping keep people out of the hospital. We remain cautious as we are seeing an increase in new cases overall and will monitor the incidence. Please continue to take precautions so that we can remain in the green and enjoy the warmer days. Reminder that the Pennington Co., Custer Co., are high risk areas per SDDOH.
